

BSB50820 Diploma of Project Management





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Overview

The AMCA Diploma of Project Management is a nationally accredited course that provides industry specific training for individuals that are in a project management role in the air-conditioning, engineering, mechanical services and commercial construction industry. Modern, efficient training facilities and the latest in learning technologies and equipment provide the ideal learning environment away from the demands and distractions of the workplace.

AMCA Australia's program gives middle / upper-level management personnel:

- information and aids to help them manage more effectively
- builds on their industry experience and improves their management skills
- provides formal recognition for the management skills they have already achieved and will further develop in this course.

In summary, the course provides students with intensive in-depth training in the fundamentals of managing for profit in this industry

Participant prerequisites

Those who will gain the most are students who have had experience managing small to medium projects.

This course enables those with exposure to construction, service and facilities management to very quickly increase their skills so they can take on bigger and more challenging work with confidence.

 It is highly preferable that applicants have at least one year in a project management role as access to current projects is required to complete assessment activities

or

 Hold the Certificate IV in Project Management Practice qualification with a preference of two (2) years of project management environment experience

How to apply

Applicants are required to take an online suitability questionnaire and a face-to-face interview to assess the suitability of the course to their needs. This will include a language, literacy, and numeracy assessment (LL&N).

AMCA project management course

This course exposes those responsible for managing cost centres to systematic strategies for achieving better and more profitable outcomes.

Course work covers aspects of management including:

- Planning, OHS, risk assessment, human resource management (HRM), productivity improvements, scheduling, communication, negotiation skills and environmental management.
- Managers will value the skills they learn by sharing experiences with their peers and other professionals in the field.
- Through their involvement, each person participates in multi-disciplinary course activities with specialist trainers and industry personnel who have diverse experience.
- Students benefit from the immediate payback the program provides. It is recommended that students decide on their personal action plans and goals prior to beginning the program. Such goals may range from improving cost control, completion timeframes to variations and extensions of time needed to protect profitability



Trainers and presenters

Training and assessment is led by a qualified trainer and assessor and undertaken in a blended model. Face-to-face training is undertaken in the classroom and assessment is completed in the workplace or in the student's own time.

This course also brings together high-quality specialist trainers and leading contractors. This diverse and strategically assembled team provides expertise in the day-to-day aspects of construction industry management, as well as the most advanced concepts in project management principles and technology developments.

Duration & delivery

The course duration is 20 weeks with classes that incorporate a traditional face to face delivery, distance learning such as activities with an average of minimum 12hrs/week of self-directed learning.

Face to face delivery is held over two (2) blocks consisting of 4.5 days each that are held at AMCA Australia (Burwood) in Melbourne. During this week students are also required to complete activities in their own time, this may take up to two (2) hours each day

This course incorporates group work activities and discussions. Attendance is mandatory as knowledge sharing and exchange of ideas for industry expertise is a key component.

Most of the assessments are completed in the workplace following face to face training.

Flexibility associated with face-to-face classes may be required due to COVID restrictions, whereby classes may be postponed or delivered online

Qualification awarded

Upon successful completion of all the assessment requirements of each unit, the student will be issued with a Diploma of Project Management and accompanying certificate. Those students who do not complete this course will still receive a Statement of Attainment for the units successfully completed.
